## **Erasmus+ funded students**

Please let the HR/Admin office know if you are planning to take an Erasmus funded student as a visitor in your lab.

The student should be made aware that they will not receive a salary from the University and will not be a registered student at the University or a member of a College. They will also need to find their own accommodation. We would recommend using the University's Accommodation Service, or contacting one of the colleges direct (Downing and Pembroke College have guest rooms available during term time).

The student and the supervisor will need to complete a traineeship agreement and we will need to issue a Visitor Agreement.

With regard to the insurance questions which might be part of the traineeship agreement (to be supplied by the student) please find the answers below:

## **Immigration**

As Erasmus traineeships are work placements; all NON-UK/IRISH NATIONALS will need to obtain a Tier 5 (GAE) visa sponsored by the University. Some nationalities will also need ATAS clearance before they can apply for their visa. Students staying over 6 months will need to pay the immigration health surcharge (IHS).

Before a student starts work in the Department we will need to conduct the normal Right to Work checks in person and online.
